SCHOOL SITE by Philip Ashton

Many people from the estate have asked the Residents' Association Committee whether a school is to be built on the designated site in Danvers Drive opposite Le Borowe. The answer is that no decision has been made yet.

With regard to future demand for school places, the County has to take into account all similar (i.e. primary age range) schools within a two mile radius of the proposed school site. Where the pupil forecast figure is greater than the capacity figure, then the future demand increases and a "Basic Need" exists.

At present the County are not certain that the long term "Basic Need" is large enough to warrant the cost of building a school (about £1.25 to £1.50 million). Naturally, as County state: "Pupil numbers, housing developments and other significant factors are kept under regular review and are acted upon when a need becomes apparent." One of these housing developments is the Velmead Stud Farm: if this development proceeds then County are far more likely to authorise building of the school.

With regard to the actual site, this is owned by Hampshire County Council and they have stated that there is no option for a developer to buy it. The current site would house an infants school with a capacity of up to approximately 225 pupils but with a minimum number of 160 pupils.

FOOTPATH BARRIERS

Your Committee have consulted Hart with regard to increasing the narrow separation of the footpath barriers which appeared around the estate. Their purpose is one of safety and the design is intended to have 1 metre separation. The Council will not agree to a separation of more than 1.4 metres and state that cyclists must dismount at each barrier. If you are not happy with this write to Hart Council!



CHILDREN'S PLAY AREAS

Hart District Council has invited the Zebon Copse Residents' Association to suggest locations on the estate for a children's play area. The Council has up to £25,000 to spend. They also seek views on the age groups and numbers of children likely to use the facilities.

Possible locations identified by the committee are shown on the map below. The only constraints are that the location must be on designated open space and that there is a consensus of agreement by residents especially those adjacent to the site. Note that the school site is unlikely to be an option.
